

Headteacher's Message - Adele Christofi

Welcome back to the second half of the Autumn term, I hope you enjoyed the two week break, I know I certainly did! It has been great to come back to work and to see the school community, both staff and students looking refreshed, and ready for the term ahead.

This week we remember those who fought in both World Wars and who fought for our freedom. This year's theme is 'Service' to mark key anniversaries of different wars. It is the 70th anniversary of the armistice, which ended the fighting of the Korean War. Alongside this it is the 75th anniversary of the arrival of settlers from the Caribbean on the Empire Windrush and the Royal British legion is this year exploring the connections between the Armed Force and Windrush Generation, and to mark their service and the part the Windrush Generation played in rebuilding post war Britain. To highlight the theme of remembrance, all students have had assemblies, which have been underpinned by the school's core value of integrity. Being kind and caring and being able to solve conflict in a diplomatic way, means that our children will have the chance to have more peaceful lives, and the centre of this starts with education and how we solve conflict and deal with issues at school.

This week we also had a reset on expectations and Roll Call started on Monday with replenishing any lost pens and doing a full and thorough uniform check. Students look very smart and are coming to school ready to learn. I'd urge parents to ensure that they support their children in being ready to learn, by checking that they have all the uniform and equipment they need.

This week, we also had the GCSE year 11 revision evening, which was dedicated to helping students prepare for those allimportant exams. It was great to see such a fantastic turnout. Both students and parents were given advice on revision, attendance, alongside key information from English, maths and science leads. Year 11 are really stepping up their game and it's been a pleasure meeting my mentees this week, who were talking me through their timetables and discussing any further support they need. Mock exams start in two weeks.

Years 7, 8 and 9 students are in the process of doing assessments with reports being completed in the next few weeks. Likewise, Years 10 and 11 students have completed the first set of assessments and will be shortly receiving their progress reports.

We have a number of trips going out over the next few weeks, so please respond to the letters and make payments on ParentPay as it is a huge admin task our end if deadlines are not met. Trips are a vital part of a child's education and experience, which is why we have made arrangements to ensure that all students will have a place, and only their behaviour would prevent them from going.

Finally, on Wednesday the 15th of November we have our very first Laurus Nobilis Awards ceremony, which we are very excited about. I look forward to updating you next week.
