





Our lunches cost just £3 per day or £570 per year






School Shoes

No Stanley Cups. 500ml max.



Cover what they just learnt and repeat the definitions to themselves.


WRITE


Write out those key terms and definitions in their selfquizzing books.

Curriculum

Key Stage 3 - Year 7-9

During Key Stage Three, students study a wide range of subjects including English, Maths, Science, humanities, arts, languages, and PE to give them a full and balanced education.

Key Stage 4 - Year 10-11

Our current Year 9's have chosen to study 8 GCSEs including

- 5 core options English & Literature, Maths, Combined Science
- Option subjects Languages, History, Geography, Triple Science, Business
- A wide range of vocational subjects Computing, Media, Sport Studies, Music, Beauty and many more.

Curriculum

Key Stage 5: Year 12-13

- Our Sixth Form is small and supportive, offering hands-on courses like Business, Science, Sport, and Beauty to prepare students for real jobs.
- Rated "Good" by Ofsted, and helps students grow in confidence, learn life skills, and get ready for their future.

Smart Intervention

- The SMART Intervention helps students who find regular school hard due to behaviour, attendance, or personal challenges.
- It gives them the support they need—academic, emotional, and practical—so they can get back on track with their learning.


Awards

Clubs, Enrichment and Trips

All of our subject areas offer a variety of clubs and activities at lunch time and after school. Sports Clubs, Robotics, Debating and homework club are just a few examples.

All clubs are free of charge.

We run a 'trips for all' programme.

Our current Year 7's have enjoyed trips to see a Christmas Show at Chicken Shed Theatre, Tower of London, The Royal Opera House and Whipsnade Zoo. There have also been curriciulum specific trips for selected groups of students.

Tutor Time Reading Programme

We read together for 25 minutes every morning starting at 8.25am.

By the time your child leaves Laurel Park, they will have been read at least 25 books aloud by their Form Tutor.



Equipment checks

- A school bag is required each day.
- All school books required for that day should be brought into School
- A full pencil case to include:
 - black pen,
 - 2x green pens,
 - blue pen,
 - ∘ red pen,
 - 2x pencils,
 - sharpener,
 - rubber,
 - ruler,
 - highlighters,
 - semi circle protractor,
 - set of colouring pencils,
 - scientific calculator.

Lessons

No pupil has the right to disrupt the learning of others.

Teachers will have disruption free classrooms in which they can teach

Students will have disruption free classrooms in which they can learn.

Students who do not follow these expectations will be removed for a whole school day to continue their learning in our Out of Lesson Provision.

The vast majority of our students remain in all their lessons throughout the day.



Behaviour in the community

From the moment students put on their uniform, to the minute they take it off, they are members of our Laurel Park community.

We care about everyone in our community—like bus drivers, shopkeepers, neighbours, and each other.

We expect Laurel Park students to behave respectfully and responsibly, even when they are outside of school.

We will sanction poor behaviour in the community and parents will be called in to discuss in more detail.

Laurel Park is a completely phone free school

New Mobile Phone Rules – From September 2025 (Year 7 Only)

- Smartphones will not be allowed in school.
- Basic phones (for emergency calls only) and tracking tags are still allowed.
- Smartwatches, earbuds, and large headphones are also not allowed.
- Any prohibited devices seen or heard will be confiscated.
- This policy is in line with other Enfield schools.



Other devices like tablets, computers, and games consoles also give access to:

- Online chat
- Live streaming

Parents should consider how these devices are being used at home. It's important to have controls and supervision in place.
