

Headteacher's Message - Adele Christofi

Welcome back to our school community. I hope that you all had a well deserved break with friends and family. This is a very short term indeed so we must all make the most of it!

Before I update you on this week's news I'd like to say a big well done to the Year 11 students who came in over the holidays to complete intervention lessons with their teachers. Also, a huge thank you to staff who came in to support our young people, preparing them for their exams.

This week, we received news that we won a small grant from the Tesco Sure Starts programme, which is fantastic news. We put a bid in to fund our enrichment programme, and then hoped that customers in various Tescos stores would place their blue chips from the checkout into our project....which they did! The money will go towards our school garden that Mr Martin is working towards with groups of students.

This week also saw our Year 9 parents invited along to the Options Evening presentation. We are well into the process of choice making, which is essentially the first major decision that our students will make in their education pathway. I am incredibly proud of the curriculum we are offering, as it is broad, balanced and gives students a range of options both in academic and vocational pathways.

Over the half term break, I received a very well written email from one of our Year 11 prefects, who wanted to discuss how we could further develop provision for Year 11 students to enable our young people to further better prepare for their up and coming mock exams. He suggested a study space beyond the intervention times after school, more exam practice opportunities and easier access to past papers. In true Laurel Park form, we have put this into action. From Monday 26th February, we will be launching 'Champions Hour'. This will be a study space that will be staffed by the senior teams and will operate between 3.15pm and 5.00pm every day. Students will be given a snack and drink and will have the chance to work and revise in a silent space. Champions Hour will operate on Mondays, Tuesdays and Thursdays. On the subject of Year 11, a reminder that Mock 2 exams will start on Monday 26th February and will operate in a very condensed format for a week and a half. Please support your children as we are moving towards the time that is most stressful for them.

As part of our commitment to equality and diversity in the school, Mr Akubuko has delivered assemblies this week on the subject of unconscious bias. He explained to students how this emerges and factors that affect bias in society and what we must do as people to consciously ensure we are inclusive, celebrate each other's, cultures, religions and other differences that make each of us unique. This supports and encompasses our overall school values of IDEA and our drive to make our young people the best versions of themselves, ready to go into society. It was great to see our students so focussed on the theme. One of the special aspects of our school is the diverse makeup of both students and staff.

We are very busy working on our Sixth Form, so I hope to be able to share more information soon on the curriculum offer we will be launching for September 2024.

Laurel Park launches new homework policy for KS3

All Year 7-9 parents will have received a letter about our new homework policy - **self quizzing**

We have decided to do this as self quizzing is proven to significantly improve the retention of information in the long term memory through retrieval practice. Educational research shows that recalling information from memory actually helps our ability to memorise information over time. As a result pupils who regularly complete self quizzing homework are more likely to achieve at the highest grade.

All students should complete 20 mins of homework per night in the subject according to their timetable. This will be checked each morning by their tutors. We would appreciate your support in this new initiative.
