

Headteacher's Message - Adele Christofi

Another busy week at Laurel Park School, particularly for Year 10 students. This week Year 10 went to the Guildhall to take part in the London Careers Festival. Students had the opportunity to discuss careers with industry experts and various professionals. Some students came back to school particularly excited about the Aviation opportunities they discovered and enjoyed themselves in the flight simulators! Thanks to Ms Gray for coordinating the day and navigating the year group on public transport!

Year 10 and Year 11 students were taken by the drama department, as part of their GCSE course, to the Lyric Theatre in Hammersmith to watch an adaptation of Franz Kafka's Metamorphosis, which explores the narrative of Gregor Samsa and the struggles he faces trying to provide for his family. The pressure literally turns him into a dung beetle. The performance was done in the style of Frantic Assembly, which is a style that centres on physical theatre and movement. The students were very engaged and were particularly impressed with the set design, lighting, sound and physical strength of the main actor to be able to move around the space. I was impressed with the kindness of students on the underground, who effortlessly offered their seats to members of the public. It's always lovely to see and receive positive feedback from the community.

Sticking with Year 10, students had a sexual health workshop on Thursday of this week, which is a key part of the curriculum. As students start to mature and go through puberty, as educators, we need to ensure that they are presented with key facts and teachings that are accurate. Unfortunately, since the introduction of smartphones and social media, young people have access to a huge range of inappropriate material that presents distorted and unhealthy information on relationships. Students were given talks and workshops by nurses from the Borough of Enfield and were very mature throughout.

Year 10 also had their work experience information evening on Wednesday and it was great to see a number of parents and students there. Ms Gray did a great job in pulling together the key information and processes students will need to start working on, so that they secure a placement for the summer.

The Bank of England also came to visit this week and students had a talk about what takes place at the Bank and how the notes are made and security embedded within them. Our students were very keen to find out more and were confident to ask a range of questions. Thanks to Ms Smith for organising this - we are hoping to maintain our contact with them!.

'Champions Hour' started this week for Year 11, which is a silent study space where students can stay until 5pm. We provide snacks and drinks for the students. This week has started well and it has been a purposeful and focussed environment. Well done to those students who have started taking advantage of this provision. It's timely as Year 11 have been completing their second set of mock exams.

You will have received a letter from me earlier in the week explaining that the 15th March will be a home study day for most of the school, with Year 11s, and some Year 10s being onsite for targeted revision, coursework and public exams. The pastoral teams will also meet with parents where behaviour of a handful of students is below expectations.
